## Qualification types

The curriculum includes a range of GCSE and vocational qualifications.

The GCSE qualifications are graded on a 9-1 scale, with a grade 4 representing the 'standard pass' and a grade 5 representing a 'strong pass'.

Level 2 vocational subjects are graded Distinction\*, Distinction, Merit or Pass, with the Pass being equivalent to a grade 4 at GCSE.

## **Enterprise & Marketing**

Enterprise & marketing gives you a general insight into what makes a business work. It shows you how businesses target customers, how they set prices, how they decide when a product needs updating and how these businesses are organised.

Enterprise & marketing is a practical subject too, as you get to design a product, test it out on the market, add your own brand and pitch your ideas to prospective buyers.

## **Option routes**

#### Route 1

Students on route 1 are required to select both a language and a humanity.

Students have free choice for their remaining two options.

#### Route 2

Students on route 2 are required to select at least one of geography, history, French or Spanish.

Students have free choice for their remaining three options.

## Making your subject choices

#### Points to consider:

- Which subject choices are needed to support any future career plans?
- Which skills are required for the different subjects? Which subjects require skills that match your own?
- Are you selecting a range of subjects, which demonstrate that you have a range of skills?
- Which qualifications have the assessment format most suited to your strengths?

## Requirements

We ask students to select five choices, with the fifth choice being a reserve.

Students should indicate their order of preference for their choices.

Students cannot select both DT and engineering.

Students cannot select both food preparation & nutrition **and** hospitality & catering.

Students may only be able to complete one from computer science or iMedia..

The deadline for the completion of the online application form is **Wednesday** 12<sup>th</sup> February.
